



RE NEWS MRT ARTHUR

Year 11 Walking Talking Mock

At the time of reading this, the Year 11s will have already sat their first Paper for the GCSE Religious Education exam, on Thursday.

On Wednesday, the RE department took all the students off-timetable and gave them a 'Walking Talking Mock' (WTM). This is a process where an RE teacher completes exam questions live and explains to the students about the thinking that is going on behind each question and each answer. It is an opportunity to actively teach students how to answer exam questions and improve their exam technique. These included; showing students how to take time over reading the information in a question, explicitly discussing the thought process for each question and modelling calculations or structures for longer answers.

Mr Arthur and Miss Bevan were talking through the whole process and the skills required to complete an answer, whilst Mr Theophilou was using his iPad to write notes which was displayed on the large screen.

We wish the Year 11s well in their GCSE RE exams and in all their examinations. They have been working hard and deserve very good GCSE grades.

Year 11 Prayer Service for Exams

On Wednesday, 8th May, all Year 11s took part in a Prayer Service in the Chapel. This was led by Mr Arthur, our Director of Spirituality.

In the Service we read from the book of Jeremiah, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew. God assures His plans are for prosperity, hope, and a future. His presence brings comfort, guidance, and abundance, ensuring that goodness and kindness follow all the days of our lives.

Jesus reminds us not to worry about our needs, for God cares for us even more than the birds of the air and the flowers of the field. Instead, we are encouraged to seek first God's kingdom and righteousness, and all our needs will be provided.

In his teaching, Mr Arthur spoke about importance of giving everything to God. He said:

Trust in Him, seek Him with all your heart, and do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Focus on today, focus on doing your best, and leave the rest to God."


