Lockdown Remote Learning Update Yr7-10

Dear Parents/Carers

Following Boris Johnson's announcement yesterday evening we are starting the Spring Term 2021, with schools in London closed for face to face teaching for at least the next 6 weeks. Engagement with online learning is critical for your son's future. Parents/carers will play a vital role over the next 6 weeks pupils not engaging will miss important content which will have a significant impact on future learning and results.

Expectations for Online Learning

5th January – 8th January

All students will be required to complete work set on Show My Homework (Satchel One) following their normal timetable. If they are asked to complete written work they should do this in their exercise books and neatly write the date and title and underline them as they would in a normal lesson. A picture of their work should then be uploaded to Show My HomeWork (Satchel One) or MS TEAMS as directed by their teacher.

11th January – 15th January

All students will be required to take part in a 'live' registration period for 10 minutes every morning (Yr7, 8, and 9 from 8:15am – 8:25am, Yr 10 and 11 from 9:15am – 9:25am). The registration session will happen on MS TEAMS.

All students will be required to take part in live tutor periods every day. These will last for 20 minutes and will start at 12:40pm

Online learning will continue as above from 5th – 9th January. Please check every day that your son is submitting pictures of the work he has completed so that staff can give feedback when appropriate.

18th January Onwards

Everything will continue as the previous week with the addition of some live interactive lessons from teachers supplementing the pre-recorded sessions and tasks.

All parents have access to Show My HomeWork (Satchel One), please check the site daily to ensure your son is logging in and completing the work that has been set by his teachers every day. If he does not engage he will be at a huge disadvantage when he returns to face to face learning in the school.
