CHAPLAINCY REFLECTION



"Lasallian DNA" is the latest in a series of annual themes developed by the Brother Superior and General Council following the 45th General Chapter in 2014. The themes are intended to help Lasallians gain insights and develop integrated responses to extend and deepen the relevance of the Lasallian mission. "Lasallian DNA" is the ninth theme, which was announced prior to the 46th General Chapter in 2022.



The logo consists of the following elements:

 \cdot An illustration of a DNA strand made up of "erratic" strokes of different lengths which express the diversity of actions with which Lasallians express their commitment to the Church, society and culture.

 \cdot The five-pointed star that refers to this historical element in the iconography of the Institute.

• The typographic set: LASALLIAN DNA with the use of the 'i' that is rotated 180 degrees and some horizontal lines that accompany some letters that represent the individual and institutional particularities that exist in our reality.
