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HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers,

It was with great pleasure that we welcomed families at the Year 11 and Year 13 'Strive for Success' evening this week. Parental events such as these are invaluable for building positive relationships, and informing parents of additional curriculum literature which can support students as they prepare for examinations.

As part of our personal development curriculum, students in Year 7 received a first aid workshop on Monday, and our Year 11 students participated in workshop on positive masculinity – thank you to all who supported in the delivery of these events. Next week, we will be welcoming the St Giles Trust, who will be delivering workshops on peer pressure and glamorisation of gangs.

I would like to thank everyone in our community who supported the college in our annual open evening last Thursday - a great success for all involved. It was heartwarming to speak in our chapel full of prospective families. I very much hope to welcome them all back in September 2024.

You may be aware of Keeping Children Safe in Education (KCSIE), a frequently updated document which provides schools with key safeguarding guidance. The latest revision of KCSIE (Sept 2023) highlights the need for effective internet filtering and monitoring in schools - a timely and sensible shift.

There is a body of research which links excessive time spent online with poorer mental health. Now that there is greater awareness of the problem, I hope that we can start to find solutions so that young people can benefit fully from technology in a way that protects them from some of its downsides.

Almighty and everlasting God, increase in us your gift of faith, forsaking what lies behind and reaching out to that which is before. Through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Year 7 First Aid Course

On the 9th October, our Year 7 students completed a First Aid Course, equipping them with the skills to make a real difference in emergency situations. From what to do when faced with a major bleed situation to performing CPR, they are now prepared to be true heroes when needed.

Mr Chester grilled his form to find out just what they had learnt during their action-packed training.

Riyad said he learnt how "If someone has a cut we can tie something around their arm and then use anything, like a phone or a hammer to tighten it, and this can stop someone bleeding and save their life."

Victor learnt how to check if someone was still breathing. He told Mr Chester, "We had to make sure that there was nothing in their mouth and if there was we had to take it out. We also learnt the recovery position."

Ky'Jah told Mr Chester that "The instructors were a police officer and the other was an army medic. She was really cool and taught us lots of interesting things."

Overall, the boys loved their first aid training describing it as "fun, exciting and cooperative".

RSE - Relationships and Sex Education

Today's young people are growing up in an increasingly complex world, living their lives seamlessly on and offline. This presents many positive and exciting opportunities, but also challenges and risks. In this environment, our students need to know how to be safe and healthy, and how to manage their academic, personal and social lives in a positive way. Therefore, the Department for Education (DfE) made Relationships and Sex Education compulsory in all secondary schools from September 2020. Relationships and Sex Education at St Joseph's College is delivered in line with the teaching of the Catholic Church and the Lasallian tradition, providing students with an understanding of the values of the Catholic faith in line with statutory requirements.

All parents have been sent a letter outlining our RSE provision for the year.

RE UPDATE

Year 8 students participated in a memorable Bar/Bat Mitzvah lesson, where they learned about the significance of this Jewish ceremony.

Bar Mitzvah and Bat Mitzvah marks the transition from childhood to adulthood in the Jewish faith. During the lesson, they had the unique opportunity to experience a hands-on connection to Jewish culture and tradition by trying Challah bread, a sacred and braided bread traditionally baked for Shabbat and special occasions.





Year 8 have been learning about static electricity in their science lessons and using it to make fun hairstyles and "bend" water!



We have begun our English Schools cup fixtures, alongside our Surrey Cup games. Below is how they fared:

Mr Curwen's Year 7s went down 5-2 against the travelling London Nautical Academy. On the same evening his Year 8's came off worse in a game against Glyn school losing 7-1, having taken the lead in the game. Our Year 9s took on Sacred Heart School and came out triumphant in a 7-0 win, having led by six at half time. Year 10 took on London Enterprise Academy and won 7-1 and our Year 11s head through in the 1st Round of the ESFA Cup having won 4-2 against Harris Crown Wood.

Unfortunately, our Year 10s came out second place on penalties in the first round of the Surrey Cup away at Cheam High. As we head into half term, we have regular attendees at Basketball club on Monday and Wednesday evening with Mr Delaney, alongside his Thursday night Badminton club, which we would love to see more students to attend. This week will see Mr Curwens Rugby training start – with the hope of getting some fixtures

in, in the New Year.

Our Year 12/13 Chelsea Foundation programme started again this week, which is great news for our Futsal and Football players; they have been entered into a 6th Form league this year and it will be interesting to see how they fare in games within the London Borough.

Year 10 and 11 will begin to choose their options for practical PE next term – so stay tuned for that. Make sure you get your sport entry in early to avoid disappointment!

Here is an update from our Jerusalem Lasallian Communities to say that all the Lasallian schools in the area and their entire educational community are safe. They will remain in our thoughts as we pray for peace.

Missiles struck Jerusalem, and the entire country experienced a sense of terror. Following the initial bombings, Israel had to close the checkpoints between Palestine and Israel, leaving many of our teachers and staff stranded without the necessary permits to cross.

Due to this, we are providing online education to those who cannot get to school. We currently manage reasonably well despite fear and anxiety pervading our surroundings.

The situation remains highly complex.

Your solidarity, despite the physical distance, provides us with tremendous support.
