
This year Ms Ampah is the new Careers Advisor here at SJC. To welcome her into the post Bryant and Jayden asked her some questions about Careers guidance.

How can SJC help me with careers?

SJC can help you to plan, research and develop a marketable profile for yourself whether you are going on to university or an apprenticeship, the role of the careers department this year will be to provide you with all the tools to stand out in a competitive environment.

How do I access the career guidance here at SJC?

There are many ways you can access careers guidance at SJC.

Firstly, student can schedule a meeting with me as the careers lead, whereby I can provide information, advice and guidance on career choices. You can also attend a number of onsite events including our Careers fair coming up on the 19th October, open to students from KS4 and KS5. We also offer workshops with a number of industry partners, where you can also receive industry guidance and information. Finally, we have an Alumni network of former SJC students who have pursued careers you may be interested in. They can provide valuable insights and advice also.

What opportunities are currently available for us in sixth form?

At present there a wide range of opportunities to help prepare you for the next stage of your career pathway including work experience, networking opportunities to connect with industry leaders, skills workshops and many more, over the coming year we will be promoting key events and opportunities in the newsletter.

How early is too early to think about careers?

It's never too early to start thinking about careers. In fact, career exploration can begin as early as primary school, you can start now to build an idea of what you would like to do in the future by having conversations with your family, speak to your teachers at SJC as many would have had careers in industry before becoming a teacher and also come in to see where I can help you to get started with your career research.
