CHAPLAINCY REFLECTION

We are pleased to say that as of this week, Chapel Assemblies have returned to the Chapel. The theme of these assemblies was Holocaust Memorial. The official Holocaust Memorial Day was Thursday, 27th January. It is a day where we remember the six million Jews murdered during the Holocaust, alongside the millions of others killed under Nazi persecution of other groups. The Holocaust Memorial Day Trust also encourages us to remember the other genocides that followed in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur. 27 January marks the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi death camp.

Regarding this, Pope Francis said: "It is necessary to remember the extermination of millions of Jews and people of different nationalities and religious faiths." He added: "This unspeakable cruelty must never be repeated. I appeal to everyone, especially educators and families, to foster in the new generations an awareness of the horror of this black page of history. It must not be forgotten, so that we can build a future where human dignity is no longer trampled underfoot."

I share with you the prayer written by St Pope John Paul II, at the Western Wall on March 26, 2000 God of our fathers, you chose Abraham and his descendants to bring your Name to the Nations: we are deeply saddened by the behaviour of those who in the course of history have caused these children of yours to suffer, and asking your forgiveness we wish to commit ourselves to genuine brotherhood with the people of the Covenant. 


SCIENCE FEATURE

The Year 10 Triple Science class completed a Required Practical this week, looking at the products when different solutions are electrolysed (using graphite electrodes to pass an electric current through an electrolyte solution). Students worked in groups and rotated round the classroom to test the four different solutions. Their GCSE exams will have questions that assess their practical knowledge so students made sure to understand each key stage of the practical.





The Year 8s have been busy Enzyme Modelling and here are few pictures of Y12 Applied Science doing Chromatography using TLC plates to extract the pigments from Ivy, Spinach and Tulip leaves as part of their coursework.









Year 7 are studying forces at the moment, including looking at the effect balanced and unbalanced forces have on motion. To test their understanding 7Y3 used a dance mat of balanced and unbalanced force arrows with students moving in the direction of the overall force (resultant force). Miss Wilkins' DJ skills were a bit old school so the boys brought her up to scratch - there were also a few extra moves thrown in as the boys moved about.

As part of their A Level Chemistry course students complete regular assessed practicals. Y13 built and tested the potential difference of electrochemical cells using metal electrodes suspended in solutions of their ions. Because of the Pandemic this was Miss Wilkins' first time completing this practical at St Joseph's - and she was definitely the most excited of the whole group when it worked! Students worked efficiently as teams and then compared the data they collected to published values and they were very accurate in their outcome.

Next Friday we will be running a Science house event which includes all year groups. May the best house win!







ZOMBIE APOCALYPSE!!

On Tuesday, an army of Zombie Hunters gathered in the Hall to prevent the destruction of the human race. The Zombies were coming and the fate of humanity would rest in the hands of one House. WORD OF THE WEEK



Definition: a young person being trained to do a skilled job, often with a particular trade in mind.

Word class: noun.

<u>Context</u>: the concept of being an apprentice can be traced back to Medieval England, when a young person would be 'bound to their master' as they learnt a skilled trade. By the 1600s, it was compulsory to be an apprentice before entering a trade, with the most common being bakers, blacksmiths and dressmakers. These apprenticeships often began at the age of 14 and could last up to 7 years. Children as young as 5 years old were sometimes found to be apprentices for 14 years in the pursuit of become a chimney sweeper! A wage was often minimal or non-existent, with accommodation, food and clothing the most common form of payment.
