Ash Wednesday

Wednesday, 2nd March sees Ash Wednesday, thus the start of Lent. Our Year 8s will take part in the Ash Service and we thank Fr Anthony Cassidy, in advance, for offering to lead the Service.

Lent is a season of penance, reflection, and fasting which prepares us for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday, through which we attain redemption. On Ash Wednesday we wear ashes on our foreheads. The ashes symbolise the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he speaks the words:

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Ashes also symbolise grief, in this case, grief that we have sinned and caused division from God. It is important to remember that Ash Wednesday is a day of penitential prayer and fasting. Remember, Man is dust, and unto dust you shall return." (Genesis 3:19)

At the request of the Student Council, every form class will have a prayer monitor. Their role will include leading the 'lesson prayer' and the 'form time prayers' as well as supporting me in the planning, preparation and delivery of Chapel assemblies, Masses and Services. SCIENCE FEATURE


The Year 13 Chemists completed their first REDOX titration this week - as the purple potassium permanganate solution is added to an iron sulfate solution it reacts and turns colourless. When the purple colour persists the end point has been reached and they can use the volume added to calculate the concentration. Students worked really efficiently and accurately and demonstrated excellent practical skills to some trainee teachers that were observing.



Year 12 Chemists completed one of their Practical assessments this week looking at energy changes in reactions. They worked really well both in their partnerships but also as a class and are definitely honing their practical skills!

The Year 7s also spent a lesson examining and dissecting some different organs as they learnt more about blood vessels. I think its fair to say they enjoyed it!

We have once again had major changes to how the COVID-19 pandemic will be managed in the UK.This has changed the way we manage things in the College.

<u>Testing</u>

It is not a legal requirement to take lateral flow tests twice weekly anymore. Those who are in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 does not have to take daily lateral flow tests anymore.

Self-isolation

The Government has stated that it is not a Legal requirement to isolate if you have symptoms or test positive for COVID-19. However it is still advisable to isolate.

Those who catch COVID are most infectious in the first 2 days of catching it and most are not infectious after 5 days. As a college we are following guidance by asking that if a student tests positive on a lateral flow test or is unwell and has symptoms of COVID-19 that they should not come to school during the period that they may be infectious. They are unwell and this will be recorded as illness for attendance. We would ask that you inform the attendance officer as they are unwell and also inform covid@sjc.ac. Students with COVID-19 should not attend the College while they are infectious. They should take an LFD test from 5 days after their symptoms started (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) followed by another one the next day. If both these tests results are negative, they should return to the college as long as they feel well enough to do so and do not have a temperature.
