Context: Ethos means "custom" or "character" in Greek. As originally used by Aristotle (the Greek philosopher), it referred to a person's character or personality, especially in the balance between passion and caution. This concept has more than stood the test of time, with 'ethos' now used by schools, governments, sports teams and many communities to display a belief in a shared image. At SI Joseph's, our ethos is demonstrated through our 5 respects: faith, college, learning, others and ourselves. This fits into the wider ethos of the Lasallian educational institution, founded by the De La Salle Brothers, which sees our college share ethos with over 3000 Lasallian schools globally.

Following all their hard work last term, our Year 8 pupils finished their unit on Slavery this week with some fantastic speeches on ending discrimination. The boys were extremely passionate about this topic, having learned about various abolitionist such as Olaudah Equiano Harriet Tubman and how they helped to abolish slavery in the late 1800's.

Our Year 8s made the connection between these fights against discrimination by comparing them to modern day events such as the recent 'Black Lives Matter' campaign following the death of George Floyd, the racist abuse suffered by Bukayo Saka, Marcus Rashford and Jadon Sancho after the Euros 2020 final and the ongoing discrimination towards religious groups in China. They took some inspiration from famous speeches made by Martin Luther King Jr. and Elizabeth I. We definitely have some future world leaders here at SJC!!
