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

# HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Dear Parent / Carer

This week we had our second Life Skills day of the academic year. Walking around the school on the day it was lovely to see students engaged and enjoying the day. Year 9 were sharing their identity with their peers and learning about others, year 11s were undertaking invaluable revision tips and practice whilst year 7 students learnt about personal safety. Students in year 12 were involved in online careers talks whilst year 8 were busy planning election manifestos. Year 10 students' discussions around Men's' Health and resilience were extremely pertinent and maturely handled. This week some of our students in year 7 and 8 had the opportunity to go off site and visit a museum. I know they thoroughly enjoyed the event and learnt lots from it. Our House Maths challenge also took place on Thursday with high levels of engagement and determination from all students involved! Next week is a busy week, with virtual rewards assemblies taking place. In addition, many students are involved in rewards trips, and we have our annual College Christmas dinner on Wednesday 15th December.

As many of you will have seen on the news, this past fortnight has seen a sharp rise in the daily recorded incidences of Covid in Croydon, particularly amongst the 14-19 year olds. The national picture is changing on a daily basis with the spread of the Omicron variant and as a College we are constantly adapting what we do to keep our community safe. This week we have moved to virtual assemblies and we are ensuring our students (except those exempt) are wearing face masks around the College. As a school we are pleased to be able to keep all year groups in school and we have not had to move to remote learning for entire year groups, as I know other schools in our local area have.

We are disappointed to move our Carol Service to a virtual event. However, our choir and band have been working hard recording for it and I know they sound fantastic! We will be sharing the link to the service to all families on the 15th December so please do tune in and have a watch.

Next week we will be sending home an end of term letter with updates on the return to school in January. Students will finish up for the term with a half day on December 17th. Lessons will be delivered remotely on this day. As this is our final newsletter of the half term, we wish you all a healthy, peaceful, joyful Christmas break.







